CHAPLAIN'S CORNER September 2008

Back at the end of July, I participated in two ceremonies of Installation of Officers. As chaplain of both entities, I also received a charge as an officer. What impressed me was the wording. Yes, I realize that these are words of our founder, Father Michael J McGivney, as he organized this wonderful undertaking to benefit the poor Catholic men of his era. He tried to foresee all circumstances that would challenge future officers down through the ages. He must have had a vivid imagination or possibly he had a revelation of what the Knights of Columbus could become. But, I digress. What impressed me was part of the charge to the Council Chaplain. "See to it," he urges, "that you as chaplain encourage the members of the Council to remain faithful to their Catholic faith. Be ever vigilant that the members of the Council live in such a way that they inspire all around them—family, co-workers, and acquaintances—to a respect for their faith." Fr. McGivney continues, "Fear not to correct members should they begin to stray from the faith or in any sense demonstrate a departure from that faith."

Wow! What a responsibility! I know that I've heard these words annually for over 20 years now. Somehow, this year, it has impressed me more. Why? Do I have instances in mind that I should go and fraternally correct. Gratefully, not at the moment. Thankfully, men in our Council are God-fearing, honest, hard-working men who value their Catholic faith.

Many are all-their-lives Catholics, Catholics from birth, who have come into the Council as a normal course of events. I'm sure I'm not unique in this thinking. I feel sure that our deceased members thought along the same lines. They presently want as many praying for them. So, I hereby invite all members of the Council to that November 9:00 Mass at St. John Neumann. Please consult your newsletter for the exact date. There. I've said it. I've invited. I've explained. And I'm done. God bless each and every one of you.

Traditionally, Labor Day is celebrated by most Americans as the symbolic end of the summer. Labor Day has been celebrated on the first Monday in September in the United States since the 1880s. The form for the celebration of Labor Day was outlined in the first proposal of the holiday—a street parade to exhibit to the public “the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations”, followed by a festival for the workers and their families. This became the pattern for Labor Day celebrations. Speeches by prominent men and women were introduced later, as more emphasis was placed upon the economic and civil significance of the holiday. Still later, by a resolution of the American Federation of Labor convention of 1909, the Sunday preceding Labor Day was adopted as Labor Sunday and dedicated to the spiritual and educational aspects of the [labor movement](#).

The late Will Rogers once said, “I’m not so much interested in the rate of return on my money as I am the return of my money.” Understood in the context of this time period this was a real issue. 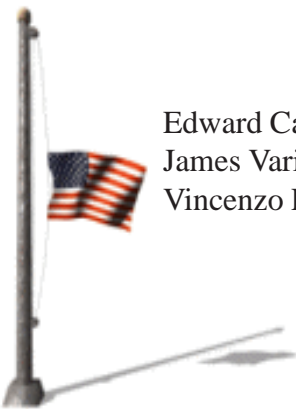
